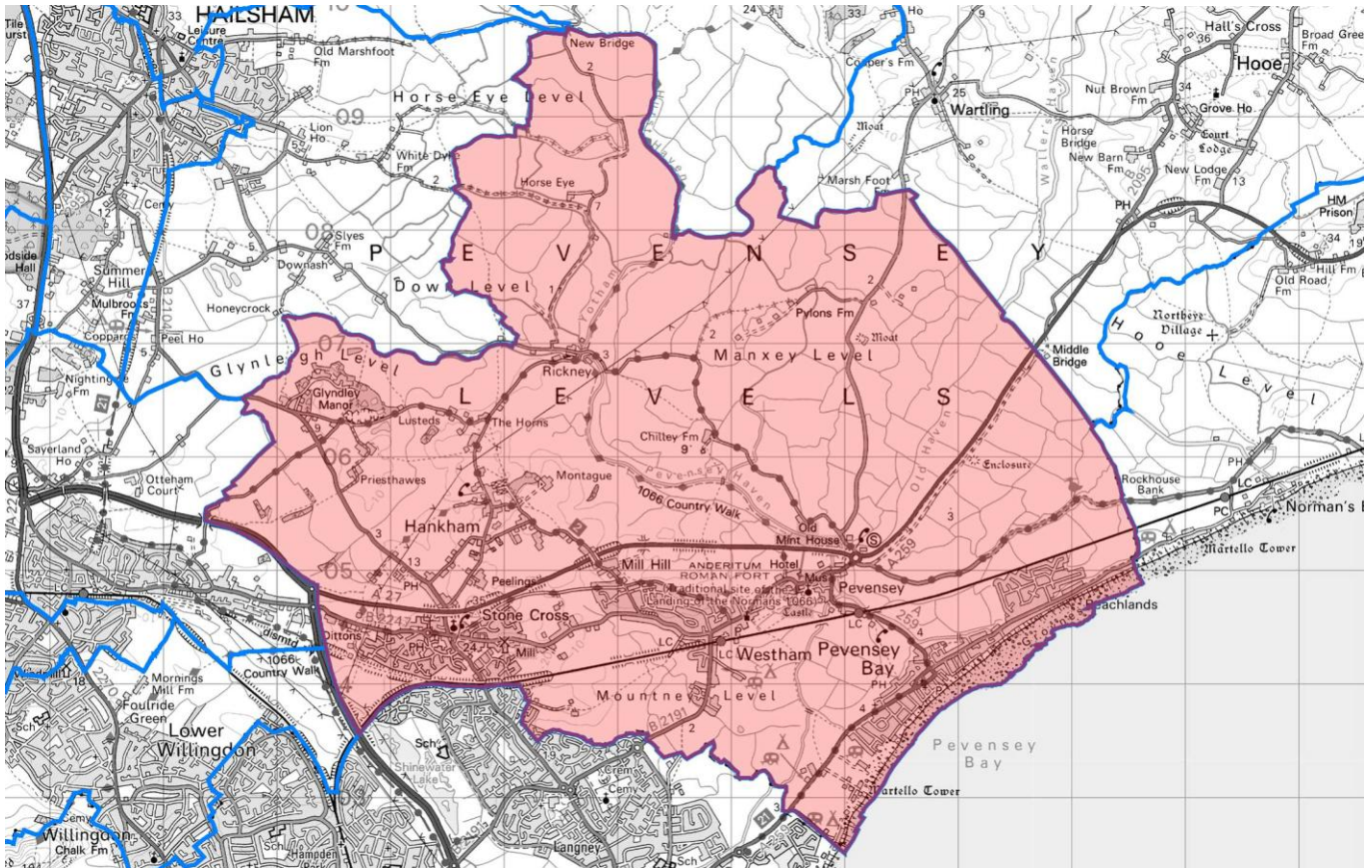

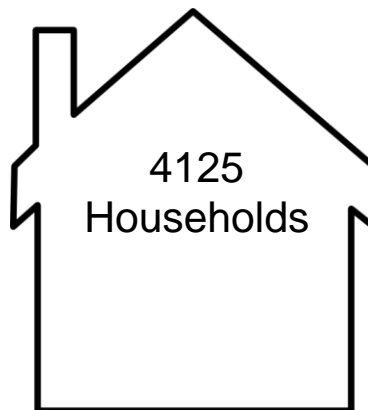

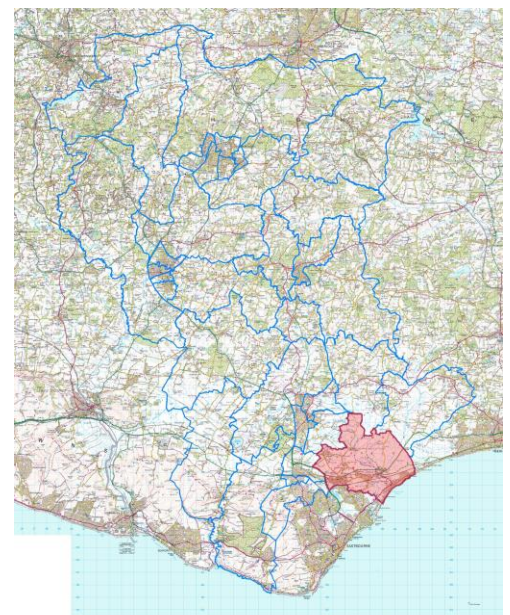
Pevensey & Westham has an area of 3,168.06 hectares which represents 3.79% of the total local authority area of Wealden.

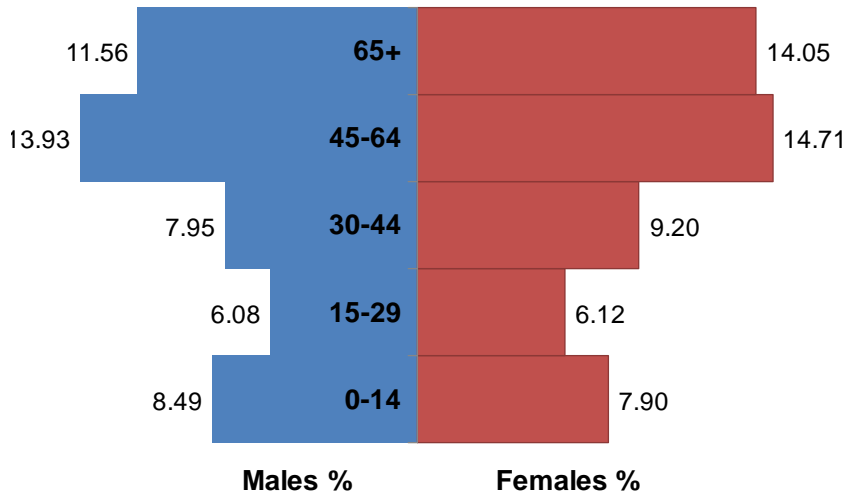

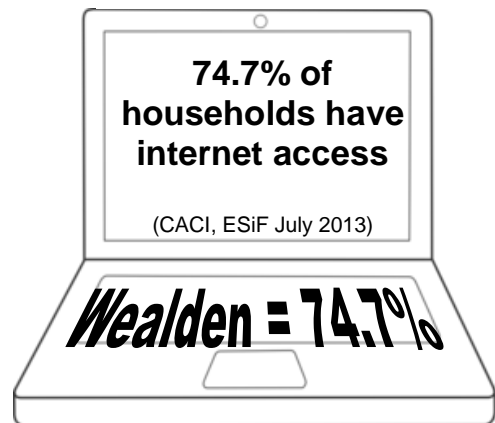
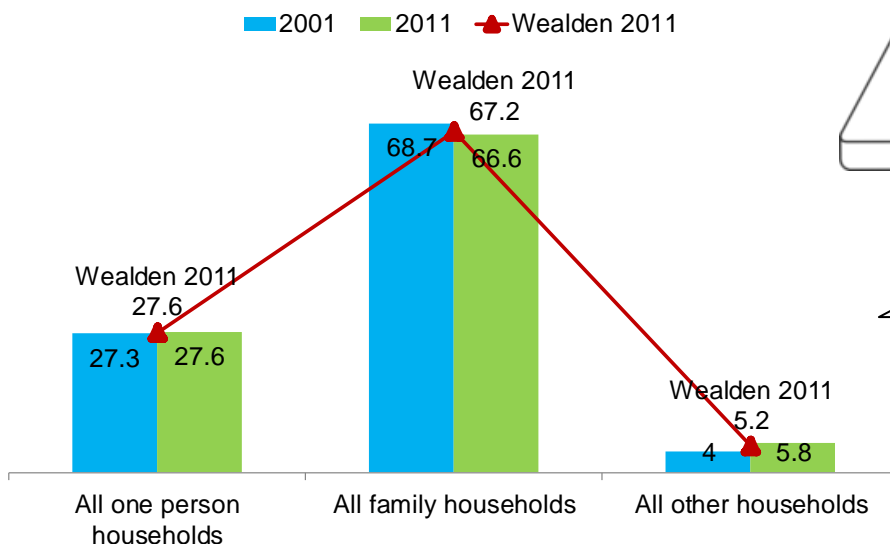
Population by Age by Gender

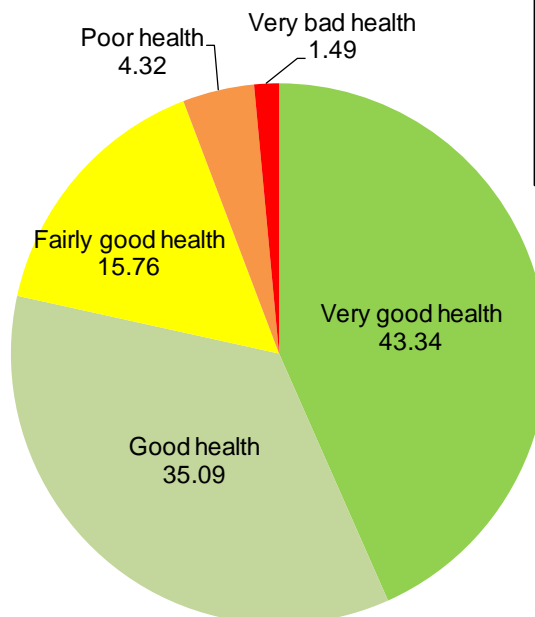
Life expectancy at birth (2005-2011)

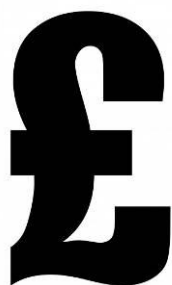
Education and the Economy in Pevensey & Westham

The highest level of educational qualification achieved by the biggest group of Pevensey & Westham residents (23.95%) is No qualifications.

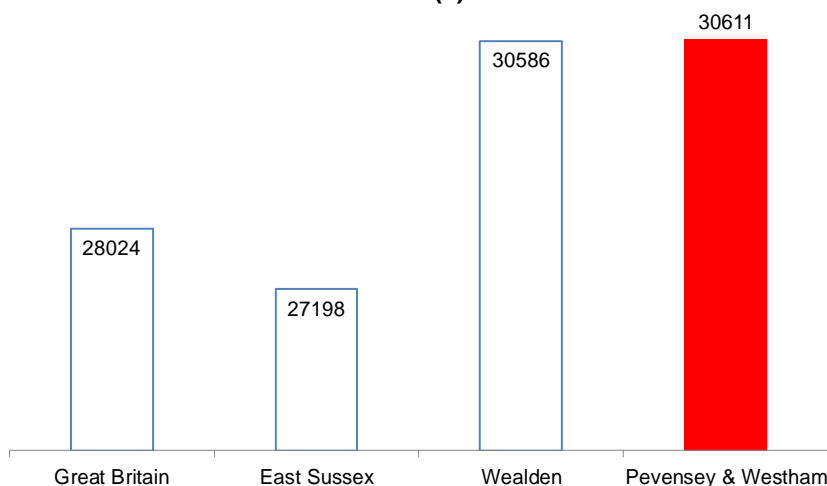

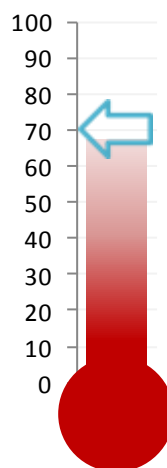
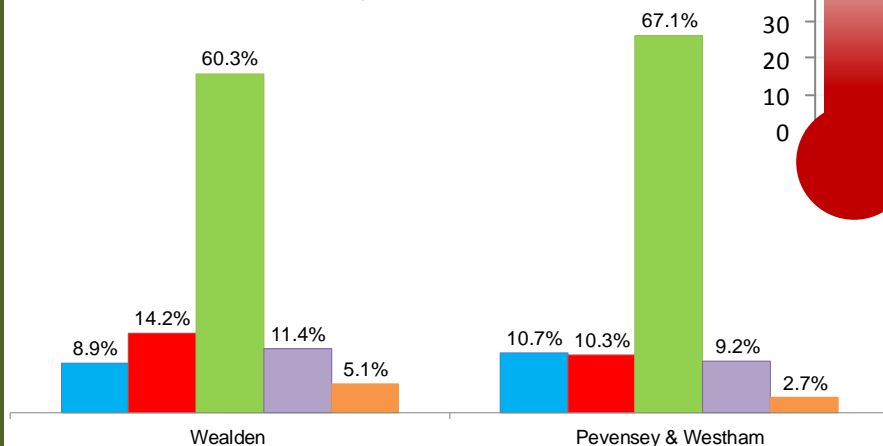
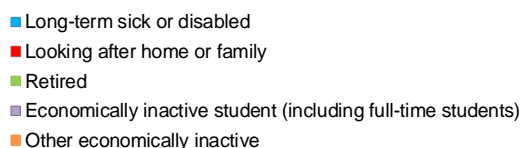
Median household income (£)

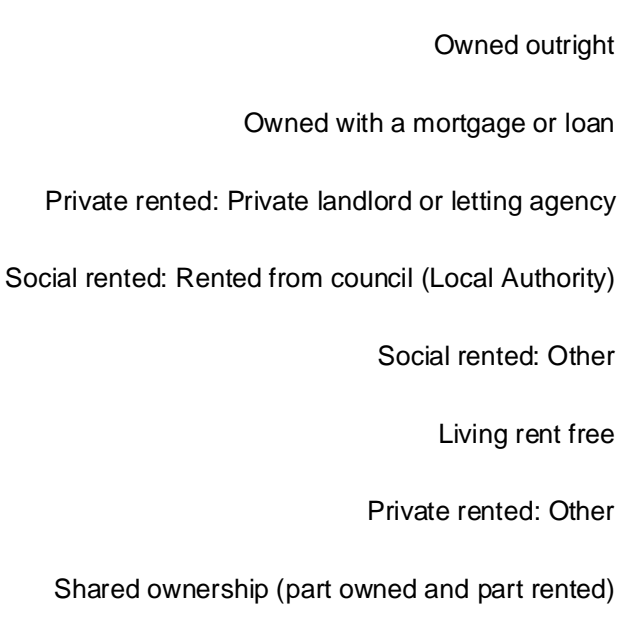
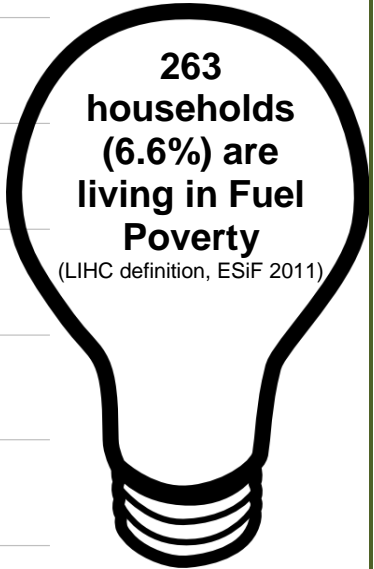
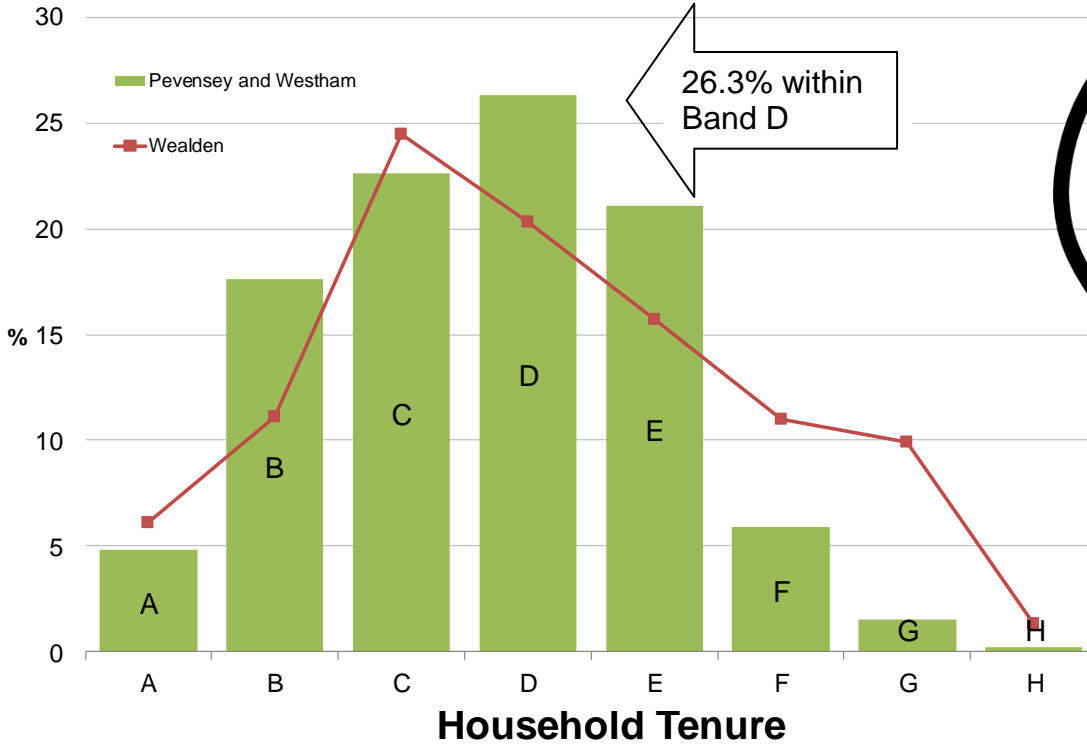

Dwelling Stock by Council Tax Band (2011)

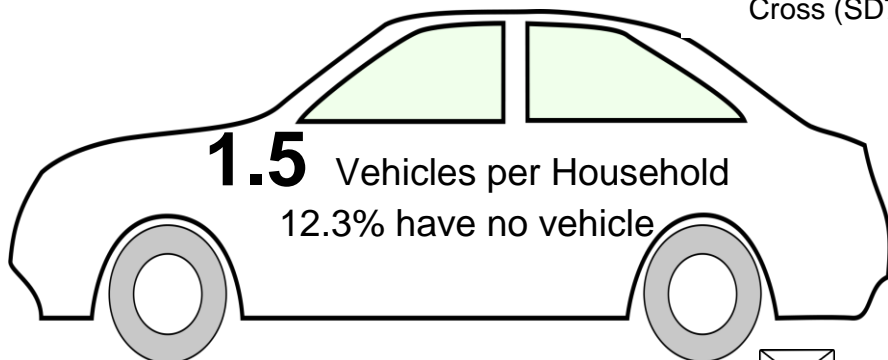

Pevensy & Westham is the Wealden ward with the highest number of both **Owned with a mortgage or loan** and **Private Rented: Other** households.

The Core Strategy Local Plan until 2027;

- Allocates a range of deliverable housing sites for around 220 homes in Land to the east and south east of Stone Cross (SD6).
- Allocates a range of deliverable housing sites for around 430 homes in Land to the north of Stone Cross (SD7).
- Will retain or provide a development boundary at Pevensy Bay and Westham.
- Will remove the development boundary as shown in the adopted Wealden Local Plan 1998 at Pevensy.
